# Te Rünanga o Ngäti Hauiti


Tënä Koutou e te whänau whanui. Well its been three whole months since our last issue and we are pleased to deliver our final Te Karere for this century and millennium.

A good example of this type of taonga is the Taiaha and Kahukiwi given as part of the dowry to Kawana Hunia on his marriage to Ruta Kau ,thus cementing peace between Ngäti Hauiti and Ngäti Apa.

If any of the whänau are aware of any taonga of this type we would really appreciate knowing about it as we feel that the relationships forged by these taonga are an important part of our Hauititanga.

#### **Economic Prosperity Sector**

It looks as though the allocation of fishing assets by Te Ohu Kaimoana will be delayed for a bit longer. Further court action is taking place which is out of our control. Rather than dwelling on what may or may not happen, we continue to make headway with our neighbouring iwi. A joint venture with Ngäti Apa and Te Äti Hau sold our annual fishing quota which saw a sharp rise in profits. The Rünanga will meet in February to discuss the priority areas for allocation of this funding.

We are getting closer to establishing a Trust that will advance economic development for Ngäti Hauiti. Already two hui have been held to discuss the Räkautaonga Trust proposal which will see a small reserve set aside as the "core" land block for development. While the constitution has been adopted, Trustees must now be appointed. This will be done at the hui a iwi on the 5th of February at 10am.

## Social Well Being Sector

The Social Well-being programmes continue to provide a range of Health and Counselling Services to our wider whänui. Remember that these programmes aim to prvide counselling, referral advice and practical support, healthcare and health education to young and old. We are proposing to hold another Rangatahi Hui In the near future. Remember that these Hui will only happen if the demand is there. So these are the particulars to date:

Venue: Tautahi Marae, Winiata, Taihape.

**Proposed Dates:** Due to a lack of interest the January Rangatahi Hui is postponed until further notice.

Age and Target Group: Rangatahi of Ngäti Hauiti descent aged between 12 - 19 yrs. (Exceptions will be made if your Rangatahi is currently 11yrs but will be 12 at the time of the Hui. Register your rangatahi's interest on 0800 HAUITI. Remember! this Hui will only happen if the demand is there!!!!


