MANAGEMENT SUPPORT SECTOR



Since the Management Support structure has been ratified a management plan for 2000 to 2001 has been documented. The three main areas are focused around:

- ♦ **Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Hauti.**
"The Enhancement and Preservation of



Hautitanga through the following organisations

- ♦ **Rākautanga Trust.**

A Whenua Tōpu Trust that provides a basis for the economic prosperity of Ngāti Hauti.

- ♦ **Te Maru o Ruahine Trust.**

"Protection and Shelter of the Ruahine Mountain Range" The social and cultural delivery arm of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Hauti, providing support to the whānau whānui of Ngāti Hauti.

Following are the service programmes provided by Te Maru o Ruahine Trust:

SOCIAL WELL-BEING SECTOR

The social well-being programmes: continue to provide a range of health and supportive services to our wider whānui. These services involve referral advice, counselling, social issues, health care and health education to young and old.

At the moment we are redeveloping our services to reach all whānau and whānui within our rohe throughout the Central Rangitikei region.

Rangatahi Hui: was held 7-9th of July at Winiata Marae, Taihape, with an excellent turn out of Rangatahi. The

focus of the hui was "Auahi Kore" smokefree. The aim is to reduce nicotine uptake in rangatahi with the inclusion of the wider whanau.

Our social well being manager Heather Gifford feels it looks quite promising with a few of our whānau members giving up as well. "Kia pakari", you have our support.

Many thanks to our whanaunga Trevor Shailor, and the Health Sponsorship Council for your support and sponsorship of our hui.

A big 'kia ora' also to our whānau and the resource people who have given up their time to share their skills and take part with our rangatahi. It certainly helps make it become a success.

Parenting Support Course: An eight-week pilot course aimed at parenting skills is being held at the Rangitikei health Centre, Marton. Parent Support Services will be facilitating the course.

Te Waka Hoe 2001: We are planning to hold two weekend events in Jan/Feb 2001. The emphasis of these two shortened events will be upon leadership skills, water skills, safety and fitness. We will keep you posted on dates etc.

Kapa Haka: We are starting practices again. Sunday August 27th, 1.30 p.m. at Rātā Marae.

We want to get our pātere Taua Hokia down pat in preparation for the reawakening of Te Whare Tūpuna Oruamātua some time toward the end of the year.

We will also be learning several others, the one that Wairemana Campbell put together during the Waka Hoe and two others that Nichola Chase brought to the Iwi Wānanga in April. Naumai haere mai kia koutou ngā manu waiata o Ngāti Hauiti

Pouwhenua: Is another project in the planning stage. We are looking at creating three pouwhenua and placing them at strategic sites in the rohe.

Each pou will possibly be a depiction of Hauiti and the relevant hapū tupuna of the area in which each one is to be erected in. The focus of this project is to reaffirm the whānau and hapū as the under pinning strength of the Iwi.

Outstanding Achievements: Rātā Cornell is currently drawing up a draft project plan following the hui held at her place in May. We will keep you informed of any progress

ECONOMIC PROSPERITY SECTOR

Since the last Te Karere I have been getting to know how the Trust operates and learning the admin systems. We have been looking at options for computer programmes to deliver customised financial reports to the Sector Managers so that they have up to date printouts of how the finance is going in the projects they look after.

Our new Financial Year has just started and the timing is right to set in place

some extra finance programmes.

A lot of time has also been going into getting new funding applications prepared and submitted. We have also reached the conclusion of some previous funded projects and have been preparing final reports to the funding organisations, which gives them an account of what we have achieved and how we spent their grants.

The new double garage project is under way. We called for tenders from all the kitset garage firms we could find to supply the kit-set building and put it up as well. The best price came from Colin White builders of Whanganui who builds Versatile Garages.

The Building Permit has been approved by the District Council and work preparing the site commenced on Thursday 6th July. So we will soon have a double garage with a separate room at the back.

A welcome addition as the office is a wee bit like a sardine can at times what with up to twelve staff and volunteers utilising it from time to time plus all the resources and records to be stored.

And there is one big lesson I have learned real fast. Don't speed along the Rātā straights!

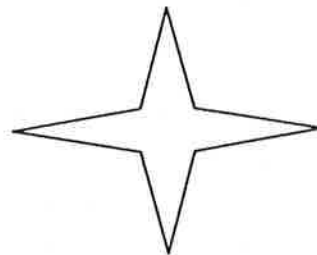
