Social Well Being Sector

The early part of this year has been a very busy year for our health service. Yoga classes have been running fortnightly in Rata and have recently started in Utiku... but would like to see more of you there!!

Our fortnightly 'Mirimiri clinics' are well attended at Rata. Uncle Bill Bennett and Shona Johnson come from Whanganui to tautoko the clinics.

Te Kotuku Hauora o Rangitikei has been running monthly focus groups where whanau can gather, korero and do an activity. The last one was held in Rata where whanau got together for a cup of tea and Aunty Erena demonstrated her 'rock painting'. It's an opportunity for whanau to give feedback about our Health service.

A two day Rangatahi hui was held at Tahuhu marae last month., Twelve rangatahi attended our hui including six from Ngati Hauiti. Activities included tree planting at Rata Marae, watercress picking, rock painting and fishing. The hui was enjoyed by all who attended. We will be running another rangatahi hui (13-18yrs) in the next school holidays.

Research & Development

Tips and Ideas on Parenting Skills (T.I.P.S)

Whakauae Research Services, Te Kotuku Hauord o Rangitikei and Te Maru o Ruahine Trusts parenting programme, TIPS, gives you the chance to find some answers to help you cope with everyday parenting problems. The programme will be run at Tahuhu and Rata Marae every Thursday between 10 am and noon.

TIPS is a parenting skills development programme that will help you gain the skills you need to cope with everyday life as a parent. It's a chance to find some answers to help you with parenting challenges.

Our programme has been developed over a number of years and has helped hundreds of parents improve their relationships with their children. TIPS have been successful both in New Zealand and Australia. An evaluation of the programme in 2005 showed that the TIPS Parenting Skills Program led to positive outcomes for parents and children and was very highly rated by participants. TIPS is:

- Ngati Hauiti based and run
- Run by trained facilitators
- A package with sections that can be used, left out or rearranged
- An opportunity to meet other parents
- 2 hours per week over eight weeks
- Flexible you decide what to try
- A supportive non-threatening environment
- NO COST!

Following is a list of all our TIPS modules:

FEELINGS looks at the positive change in behaviour when you recognize children's feelings. LET'S WORK TOGETHER has 5 TIPS on getting children to do what you want without a hassle.

INSTEAD OF HITTING WHAT CAN I DO? Discipline without damage.

DEALING WITH TANTRUMS Why they happen, how to avoid them and how to cope with them.
RESPONSIBLE CHILDREN Give children choices. Share family responsibilities.
KEEPING CHILDREN HONEST is about understanding honesty and how to get children to

HOW TO MAKE CHILDREN FEEL GOOD ABOUT THEMSELVES Help build children's self esteem and self image.

GOOD LABELS BAD LABELS Recognize how labels can impact and determine children's behaviour.

TEENAGERS is about the trials of becoming an adult with simple tips for parental support.

FAMILY FUN is about doing things together, having a good time and playing together.

Environmental Management

Rauhuia continues to be busy processing resource consents throughout the Rangitikei and western Manawatu. Issues including major road realignments, gravel extraction, water abstraction and discharges of pollutants all come to our attention and are dealt with through our processes of Cultural Impact Assessments

Ngati Hauiti has a major role on Nga Pae o Rangitikei, a collective of the hapü and iwi of the Rangitikei River, which is charged with the enhancement of the mauri (life supporting capacity) of the River. Nga Pae are in the process of finalizing their Strategic Plan, which sets out what and how they intend to improve the local environment.

Some interest has also been shown in restoring a tribally significant lake near Utiku called Lake Oporoa or more commonly referred to as

Haddons Lake. Consultation with the whanau property owners has just commenced and it is hoped that they will support this project. If you are interested in doing something about our environment and working on the lake restoration contact Utiku on <u>u.potaka@xtra.co.nz</u>
