## **Cultural Affirmation**

Raihania Potaka our Cultural Facilitator continues to work tirelessly on cultural development. To assist her with her incessant workload we appreciate the efforts of Tessa Haami Jones and Cass Stark. Some of the activities they have organised or been involved in the last six months are:

Waka Hoe: This biennial event is being held on the 15 - 19<sup>th</sup> January 2005, Wellington Anniversary weekend. Mark this on your calendar, as it is a journey well worth taking. The waka hoe will start at Omatane and end at Rata. If people are intending on committing to this event, be prepared and take a couple of days off work. Pourewa Urupa Whänau Hui: A hui was held at Rätä marae recently to discuss an ongoing maintenance strategy for the Pourewa Urupa. It was a very positive, constructive hui whereby a well- outlined plan was put in place. A further hui was held on the 31st July to discuss tikanga associated with the urupa. It is important that whänau attend this hui as more and more whänau are wishing to be interred at Pourewa however they are unaware of associated tikanga.

Many thanks to Tama Potaka, Thomas Curtis and the Potaka Whänau Trust who have taken up the responsibility to address this kaupapa, which is ongoing. At present the urupa is beautifully maintained and landscaping is in the developmental stages.

The constitutional hearing of Te Räkautaonga Foundation occurred in July. This trust is almost ready to receive whenua gifted or land banked for future prosperity.

# **Environmental Management**

Rangi Hawira continues to administer and manage all environmental matters pertaining to the iwi. Rangi is being kept very busy conducting impact assessments due to the floods earlier this year. His work is not only beneficial to Ngäti Hauiti but also to neighboring iwi.

# **Management Support**

Resource Centre Maintenance: Some of the funds from the 'Tangaroa' fundraiser evening were used to help re roof the building. We were fortunate that the labor has been donated by the Bason whänau. A big kia ora goes out to Hoani Bason and Michael Wardlaw for your awesome mahi and their mahi tautoko Neville Bason, Renee and Bill Hill.

Thanks also to Larry Kavanagh for his carpentry and handyman skills. For those visiting the marae complex your intended destination is a lot clearer now thanks to the signage put in place.

Treaty Claims: The claims committee has held hui to discuss the processes that they must take to make their claim effective. It is estimated to take seven years and a cost of \$1.5 million to present their grievance claims on behalf of Ngäti Hauiti and the other hapu/iwi of Mokai Patea. It is envisioned that this will be excellent learning process for us as an iwi. The committee looks forward to the challenges they confront.
